

Southwell Leisure Centre



Rumours are flying around town about the future of the Leisure Centre. Conservative District Councillors, along with their MP, have started scare stories after the closure of the swimming pool for tests on 29th October.

It has been known for some time that there has been some water loss. Lib Dem Councillor Jeremy Berridge, the new Chair of the Leisure Centre Trustees, reports that the safety checks on the 60 year old pool were needed. He is pleased that the tests to date indicate that the concrete pool basin is sound but that the original pipe work is corroding and will need replacement.

The problem was known to the previous Conservative administration which did nothing to resolve it. The District Council is now being pressed by the Trustees to undertake the pipe replacement as soon as possible. Recently Newark and Boughton have had new swimming pools but our pool is now nearly 60 years old.



The Government has made another promise! This time it is £8.3 billion to fund pothole repairs, but only £2.2 billion will go to the East Midlands the lowest Regional allocation. However, funding will be spread over the next 11 years, even though urgent repairs are needed NOW.

Next year only £150 million has been allocated, less than 2% of the promised total funding. Recently the RAC reported that the number of cars requiring repairs because of potholes has risen by 50% in the last year. The average repair cost was £440 and that excluded replacement tyres.

It is estimated that £14 billion is the minimum needed to put right a decade of neglect due to funding cuts for road maintenance. Is the Government really serious about ending the pothole crisis, or is it yet another hollow promise?

Storm Babet in October provided the first major test of our new flood defences. Overall, the protection schemes for Southwell worked well in the prolonged downpour. A special "thank you" to the volunteer Flood Wardens and Town Council staff for their hard work during the storm.

Sadly, eight homes in the Church Street area flooded again because the Potwell Dyke Mitigation Scheme has not even started. The scheme is designed to hold back flood water with reinforced earth banks on Harvey's and Minster Fields, releasing it in a controlled way. VIA only submitted plans in 2021 promising completion in 2022. After that, the Environment agency demanded more information to confirm structural viability. A new start date has not been announced.

Flood Funding Concerns

Ten years on from the last severe flooding, Lib Dem Councillors are demanding a start date for the Church Street and Easthorpe flood protection. The Town Council has agreed to a proposal from Peter Harris, Chair of Governance and Finance, that further Town Council funding should be withheld until the project goes ahead. It has been calculated that every £1 spent on flood defences saves £5 in damage. It really is time for the Conservative led County Council to complete the long awaited mitigation works.

Severn Trent refused to disclose the amount and times of sewage discharge into our river-following a Freedom of Information request from Peter Harris, saying that full disclosure may "adversely affect the current investigations and any regulatory or court hearings that may result" by "Ofwat and the Environment Agency [who are] conducting an investigation into sewage treatment works"!
